

i. Introduction

The Rwanda Rugby Federation, in collaboration with the UK-based charity Friends of Rwandan Rugby, has initiated a Rugby development program with the objective of providing organized sports activities in Rwanda. The primary focus is to educate children and youth in essential life skills, including the core values of Rugby: Discipline, Respect, Solidarity, Integrity, and Passion. The program aims to promote health, well-being, safety, social values, goal-setting, and turning challenges into motivational drivers. Recognizing the significant work done by the UNHCR in the Mahama Refugee Camp, particularly considering the demographic data from the February 2023 factsheet (58,248 refugees, with 50.2% under 18 years old in addition to the youth over 18 years old), the initiative was extended to introduce Rugby to young people in Mahama Refugee Camp starting from September 2023 when it was agreed to appoint a rugby development officer (RDO) in Kirehe District who is responsible for delivering regular organized sport sessions that can be accessed by young people from the refugee camp via their schools.

ii. Training Sessions

Since we started with the program in September, organized Rugby training sessions are conducted twice a week, catering to different classes at Nursery, Primary, and Secondary levels. The table below summarizes the number of sessions and participants in each category. Figures up to the end of December 2023.
