

2025 has started well for our RDOs who have been busy delivering hundreds of sessions in primary schools, secondary schools and local community groups and clubs.

In January we were delighted to have two volunteers from the UK working with the RDOs for nearly two months. Iskander and Harry are taking a gap year before starting university and asked if they could volunteer for FoRR in Rwanda.

Over the two months they supported Ernestine, Didier and Aisha in Kigali visiting schools and clubs and assisting with the training. They also took part in a tag rugby tournament for community groups in Kigali.

They travelled to Musanze to support David and to help Kamanda with a Rugby y'Abana Bato training and went to Karongi with Kamanda and Rachel to assist with the Tag for Teachers training.

They even managed to go all the way to Rusizi to work with Rachel at the schools and to coach school teams and Resilience RFC. In Rusizi they visited the Isooko women's cooperative to collect the tag belts the ladies have been making for FoRR.

Iskander's mother is the British High Commissioner in Rwanda and they arranged for a load of kit to be brought to Rwanda with the help of SOS KitAid. This kit was formally presented to the Ministry of Sports and the Rwanda Rugby Federation.





In February, all of the RDOs came together in Kigali for a whole team meeting and a training delivered by Theoneste about integrating peace education into rugby activities. The feedback was excellent and we hope to make this an annual event









Iskander and Harry also arranged a social event at the French Cultural centre to watch the Six Nations match between England and France. Over 200 people attended and raised £300 for FoRR.







As Rachel has moved from Karongi to Rusizi district, Kamanda arranged for 12 teachers from 6 schools in Karongi to have a Tag for Teachers training so the children can continue to play tag rugby until we appoint a replacement RDO for Karongi.





In February, Assinapold arranged a tournament for 14 teams in Burera district. Thank you to David, RDO in Musanze district, who travelled to Burera to support. Congratulations to Kiribata and Kabira primary schools who won the boys' and girls' trophies.
